

Equipment

Below you can find a detailed equipment list for campers and groups. Missing a piece of equipment does not stop you from participating in the camp.

A. Camper's equipment list

- Sleeping bag packed in a waterproof bag, sleeping pad, sitting pad
- Windbreaker jacket
- 2 warm, long-sleeved shirts (e.g. woollen shirt, sweatshirt, fleece jacket)
- Short and long-sleeved T-Shirts to last the whole camp
- 2 pairs of long trousers
- 2 pairs of shorts
- Socks and underwear to last six days
- Long underwear
- Sleepwear
- Cap and gloves, woollen socks
- Proper rain gear; rain jacket and pants (umbrella/trash bag are not sufficient)
- Hat/scarf for sunny days
- Towel and swimwear
- Boots or hiking shoes
- Sneakers or other comfortable shoes
- Sandals, if you want
- Bag for dirty clothes
- Cutlery: two plastic plates (at least one deep), fork, knife, spoon and a mug. All packed into a cloth bag.
- Hygiene items (toothbrush and toothpaste, soap, shampoo and other personal hygiene items, preferably biodegradable)
- Sunscreen, mosquito repellent
- Personal medicine, plasters
- Torch
- Phone (and a protective bag) and possible power bank. There are only limited chances to charge the phone at the camp.
- Knife (camp worker will store them until needed)
- Water bottle (at least 0,5 l)
- Camera (if wanted)
- Pocket money or bank card
- Small backpack or canvas bag
- Godparent's address
- Pen
- Rucksack or another easy-to-carry bag for packing the above items.

Remember, you are responsible for your equipment, so take good care of them! It is recommended that you label the items which can be mixed up with others stuff, for example, cutlery bag, electronic chargers, bags, jackets and so on.

B. Group's equipment:

The number of equipment naturally depends on group size. The stationary items can be larger and heavier than on moving camps. The items can be packed into large, sturdy boxes for transportation and storage. **Note! Small international groups should make sure their host parish if the host parish's equipment is sufficient for all of them.**

- Proper, rainproof tents
- Tent stakes
- Storage tent or heated tent (+ powder extinguisher) as necessary
- Shelters and tarps as necessary
- Kerosene lamp (and kerosene) or other lighting
- First aid kit, containing at least plasters, disinfectant, normal dressing tools for small and little bit bigger injuries
- Matches, fire starters or similar
- Pancake pans as necessary (if the parish has them)
- Free time programme equipment: yard games, arts and crafts supplies, roleplaying costumes or similar
- A saw and an axe
- Shovel (for example digging tents rain gutters) and an iron rod (can be shared with the neighbouring parish)
- Bobby pins, duct tape, and other repair supplies
- Binoculars
- Rope and string (preferably natural fibres) for building
- Hammer and nails for building
- Pens and paper
- Colours and brushes for Bible study (wood/water/wax colours and so on)
- Copy the attached Finnish sign language alphabet to the campers, if you are going to use that exercise for Friday's Bible study
- A sign with parish's and village's name for bus front window
- Parish's flag or pennant (can be done yourself if does not exist)
- Equipment for A Drop of Joy-market (please see "Programme/A Drop of Joy-market)
- Laulutulet or other songbooks as necessary
